Please note the following events/conditions during 2019:

External: Panama's general elections (every five years cycle) were held on May 5th, 2019. Previous to the Elections, all public offices and officials were into no-decision making mode. Thus, it was decided with the TI-S CrimJust coordinator that it was not the most adequate time or environment to start advocacy activities, and to wait for elections results and the subsequent change of public officials.
